The Unveiling Event

Last December's unveiling event was truly incredible. During the weekend, we had about 1,000 people come see the assembled carousel. After 65 years in storage, the carousel went together remarkably well, and it was extraordinary to have the curtain drawn back and see it assembled and spinning along with the horses aboard prancing up and down. To our great surprise and delight, we have two elaborately carved chariots, and our ponies have intricate details not usually found on traveling carousels.

Restoration Work Commences

Volunteers

We are overwhelmed by the number of enthusiastic and talented volunteers that have expressed interest in working on the myriad aspects of the project and its restoration. We do want to utilize everyone who desires to be a hands-on part of this project, and we ask for your *Patience...Please...*



We have commenced some initial work fundamental to figuring out our methodologies and approach, and the scope of work for the many and varied aspects of the restoration.

- As for the painting, so many of you are especially eager to start the repainting of the ponies and the other parts of the carousel. We are still a ways away from being ready for paint, with lots to do on the wood restoration, but in October we are planning to have a series of informational presentations combined with a hands on Painting Workshop with Bette Largent.

Stay tuned for a more in-depth newsletter on the restoration to follow as we get further along. There is plenty of work to do on the wood side of the restoration, so we will be adding more members to *The Godfather Squad* & *The Gear & Greece Gang* as work increases in pace and volume, but following is a glimpse of what we have been up to.



The gang at *Full Circle* PowderCoating have generously contributed their efforts, stripping the sweeps and rounding boards down to bare wood - enabling a little bit of forensic investigation!

- The Mechanism -

Our Chief of *The Gear & Greece Gang,* Ken Keeler, has done considerable exploratory dismantling of the sweeps and rounding boards, some of the primary components of the mechanism. Basically, he has removed all of the wiring and brackets from the sweeps, and dismantled the rounding boards down to their core frame.



With the paint off, it is interesting to see where some of these pieces were broken and repaired over the years. As the entire carousel is really hung from the sweeps, this is an important step in determining what restoration is needed prior to turning them over to "the paint department".

- Pony Restoration -

The initial team of *The Godfather Squad* (6 intrepid souls), have been working on the wood restoration of 6 selected ponies. Named the "Godfather Squad" as it has been determined that an initial part of the wood restoration process is the need to detach the heads of the ponies in order to remove the overabundance of metal nails, which in many cases is all holding them to their bodies.

There are 60 + hours of work to get a pony ready for paint. All of the initial 6 will be in primer paint by October.



Our carousel's 14 rounding boards and 14 interior art panels (one which is the Allan Herschell sign) are of prominent focus: it is these art panels that impart the character and theme; the heart and soul of its carousel.



For The Carousel of Smiles, these panels present 28 specific opportunities for individual artists to create a unique art piece, showcasing their talent and showcasing the collective artistic talent based here in Bonner County. This collection will create the identity for The Carousel of Smiles, and be reflective of its new home here in N. Idaho.
